About the Symposium

The National MOOC Symposium aims to explore some of the claims, counter-claims and unresolved debates surrounding the rapid growth of Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) in Education. This event is timely as there are a number of new MOOC initiatives in Ireland and some commentators still believe they reflect a metaphorical *avalanche* which is going to fundamentally transform the education system. The Symposium offers an opportunity for Irish educators to come together to share experiences, perspectives and lessons from the emerging research literature on the MOOC movement. Participants will have a chance to engage with two international keynote speakers who have considerable expertise in the area and gain insights from several local initiatives. The programme is designed to encourage interaction and valuable networking as we reflect more deeply on the opportunities and challenges that different types of MOOCs provide for opening up education.
